

Reconciliation through dialogue

-Invitation to a workshop in conflict management, June 28th-30th, 2003-

In connection with the Conference of European Churches (CEC) that will take place in Trondheim (June 25th to July 3rd, 2003) ISFIT in cooperation with Norwegian Church Aid will arrange a workshop in conflict management. As the main theme for CEC is reconciliation, and a group of Chechen and Russian students are invited to the conference to present their peace building efforts to religious leaders from all over Europe, ISFIT has decided to organize a three days workshop where these Chechen and Russian students will participate. In addition to these participants the organizers of the workshop would like to invite people from various conflict areas who currently live in Trondheim to participate.

The last six years ISFIT has regularly organized dialogue seminars focusing on basic conflict management skills/knowledge and reconciliation. These seminars have involved participants from different conflict areas, and it is our positive experience of bringing people from different conflict areas together in such settings that particularly encourage us to invite people also from other conflict areas also this time as it will provide unique conditions for mutual learning and shared experience.

The workshop will give the participants an opportunity to learn about general mechanisms involved in conflicts such as identity, stereotypes and enemy images, and what promotes the escalation and the de-escalation of conflict. Through a focus on basic human needs the participants will also get a touch of non-violent communication. The learning method that will be applied seeks to maximize interactivity and participation through exercises and role plays where the participants will personally experience group dynamics and behaviors characteristic of human conflict at all levels ranging from small-scale interpersonal level to large-scale interstate conflict level. Depending on the interests and readiness of the participants they will also get an opportunity to lead exercises as a start to develop themselves as facilitators/peacebuilders.

Participants: Participants should be motivated to contribute to a constructive dialogue and learning environment and a willingness to show commitment to reconciliation and peace building activities. We expect that participants are fluent in English and that they are between 18 and 70 years old.

Facilitators: The main facilitators are Gunnleif Nielsen, master student in health science, Siri Aas, master student in political science, Linda Henriksen and Vegar Jordanger, master students in psychology.

Costs: The fee for participation would normally be NOK 1500, including lunch and coffee. However, Norwegian Church Aid will sponsor all participants that are selected so the actual fee will be NOK 100 for each participant.

The workshop will take place at the idea-lab "Oasen", Richard Birkelandsvei 2A, 3rd floor (at Perleporten, Gløshaugen) and will start 9.30 every morning and is scheduled to last until 16.30. The deadline for application is Wednesday, June 25th (14.00).
